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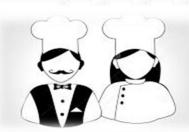

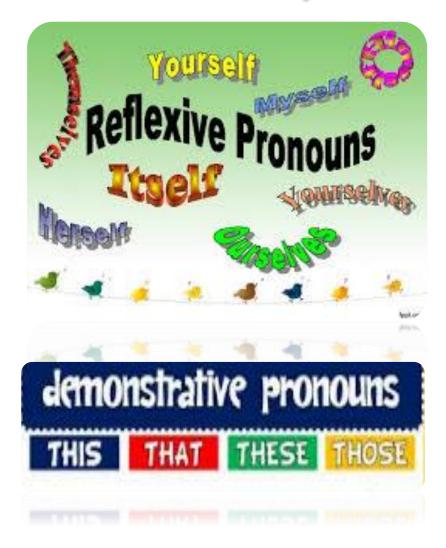

* We use a reflexive pronoun after the verb when the subject and the object are the same person

Don't cut yourself with the knife.

* We don't usually use "myself, yourself..." with the verbs wash, shave, and dress. But we use reflexive pronouns with wash and dress when we talk about small children and also animals.

Carol can dress herself in spite of the fact that she is only two years old.

* These verbs are often reflexive; "teach, look at, kill, introduce, hurt, help, enjoy, cut, burn, behave"

* If you use "by" before reflexive pronouns it means "alone"

I went on holiday alone

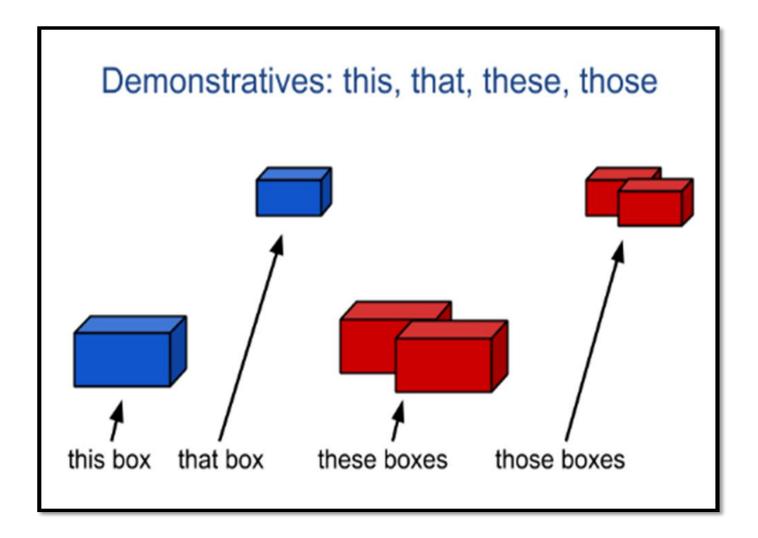
We use a reflexive pronoun to refer back to the subject of the sentence or clause. Reflexive pronouns end in "-self" (singular) or "-selves" (plural).

We can also use reflexive pronouns for emphasis (as "intensive pronouns"). For example, "I did the homework myself" emphasizes the fact that nobody helped me to do my homework.
